Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999

Revocation of an Accreditation of a Plan, Regime or Policy for the Purposes of Part 13, *Acts Interpretation Act 1901* section 33(3); Accreditation of a Plan, Regime or Policy for the Purposes of Part 13

I, NIGEL ROUTH, Assistant Secretary, Marine Biodiversity Policy Branch, as Delegate of the Minister for Environment Protection, Heritage and the Arts pursuant to sections 208A, 222A, 245 and 265 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) and section 33(3) of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901* revoke the accreditation dated 18 November 2004 for the Western Australian Onslow Prawn Managed Fishery and Western Australian Nickol Bay Prawn Managed Fishery, the accreditation dated 9 November 2004 for the Kimberley Prawn Managed Fishery and the accreditation dated 19 August 2004 for the Broome Prawn Managed Fishery.

Being satisfied that:

- The management regime for the Western Australian Onslow Prawn Managed Fishery, in force under the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Act 1994* and the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995*, requires persons engaged in fishing under the management regime to take all reasonable steps to ensure that members of listed threatened species, listed migratory species, cetaceans and listed marine species are not killed or injured as a result of the fishing;
- The management regime for the Western Australian Nickol Bay Prawn Managed Fishery, in force under the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Act 1994* and the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995*, requires persons engaged in fishing under the management regime to take all reasonable steps to ensure that members of listed threatened species, listed migratory species, cetaceans and listed marine species are not killed or injured as a result of the fishing;
- The *Kimberley Prawn Management Plan 1993*, for the Western Australian Kimberley Prawn Managed Fishery, in force under the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Act 1994* and the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995*, requires persons engaged in fishing under the management regime to take all reasonable steps to ensure that members of listed threatened species, listed migratory species, cetaceans and listed marine species are not killed or injured as a result of the fishing;
- The *Broome Prawn Managed Fishery Management Plan 1999*, for the Western Australian Broome Prawn Managed Fishery, in force under the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Act 1994* and the *Western Australian Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995*, requires persons engaged in fishing under the management regime to take all reasonable steps to ensure that members of listed threatened species, listed migratory species, cetaceans and listed marine species are not killed or injured as a result of the fishing; and

- The fisheries to which the management regimes relate are not likely to adversely affect:
 - the survival or recovery in nature of any listed threatened species; or
 - the conservation status of a listed migratory species, cetacean, or listed marine species or a population of that species;

I hereby accredit the management regimes for the Western Australian Onslow Prawn Managed Fishery, Nickol Bay Prawn Managed Fishery, Kimberley Prawn Managed Fishery and Broome Prawn Managed Fishery in force under the Western Australian *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* and the Western Australian *Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995*, pursuant to sections 208A, 222A, 245 and 265 of the EPBC Act for the purposes of Divisions 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively of Part 13 of the EPBC Act.


